



Better health care for those with learning disability

People with a learning disability are 58 times more who is going to hospital, you can refer them to likely than others to die before the age of 50. the Acute and Primary Liaison Team in one of these ways:

Breathing and heart diseases are the most common causes of death amongst people with learning disabilities.

Dear Watford Mencap

I care for my daughter who has a learning disability but I am not sure what financial help I can get. I am unable to work because of my caring responsibilities. Where can I go for help?

Many carers find it very difficult to get help and it is estimated that between 40-60% of disability benefits go unclaimed each year. Watford Mencap's Advice & Advocacy Team can help guide you through the benefits maze. There are, however, some basic rules you should follow. To begin with the disabled person should claim Disability Living Allowance which can be awarded in two parts - one for care and one for mobility. As a carer, you may also be eligible for a Carer's Allowance as well as Housing and Council Tax Benefit.
